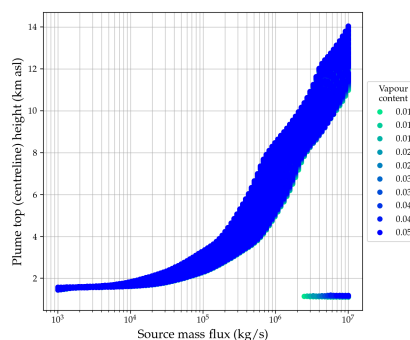
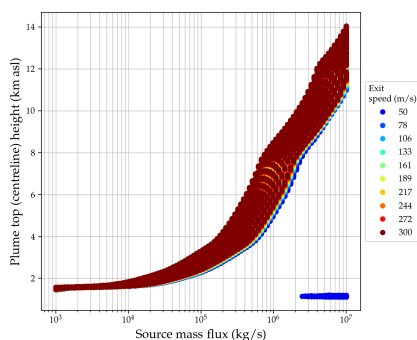
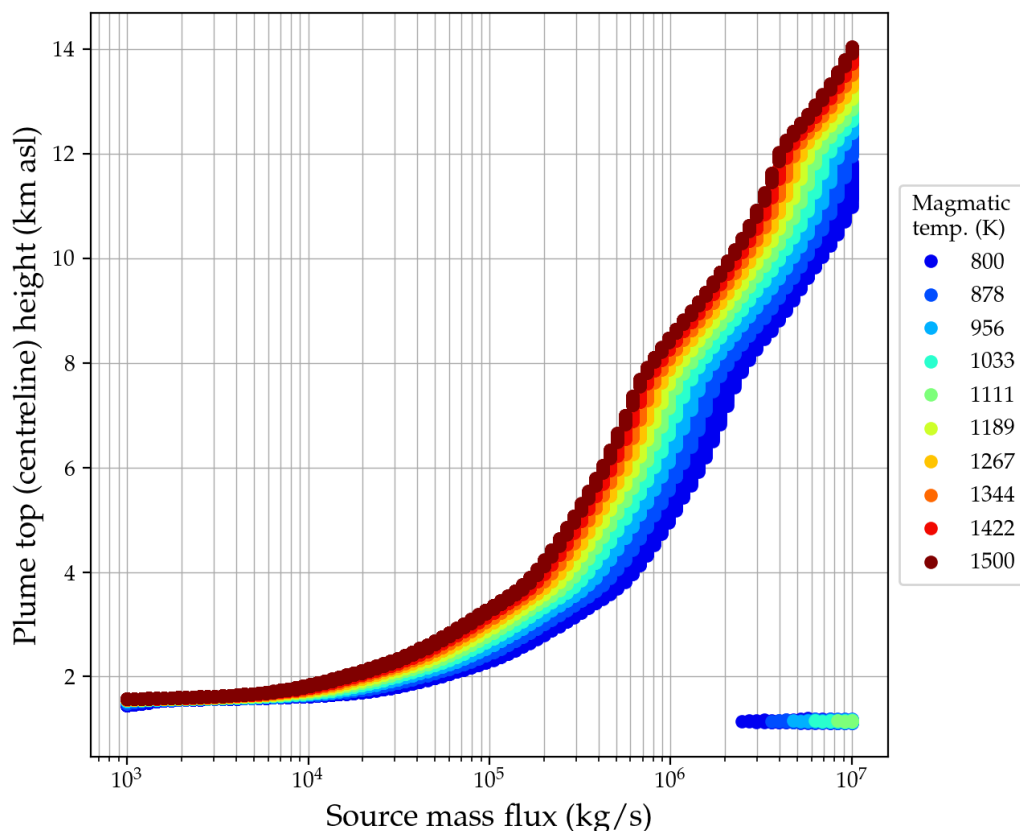


## PlumeRise – The University of Bristol wind-blown plume model
